# What is the result of my endoscopy?

The person who performed your endoscopy (the endoscopist) is concerned that you may have an abnormality in either your oesophagus or stomach.

#### **Further information**

- Your endoscopist will refer your case for discussion with the Upper Gastrointestinal Multidisciplinary Team (MDT) at University Hospitals of Leicester NHS Trust.
- Your biopsy results will take several days to be available.
- Sometimes you may be required to attend for a further endoscopy because the biopsy results have not given the doctors enough information to provide a diagnosis.

# What is the Upper Gastrointestinal Multidisciplinary Team?

The team consists of consultant doctors, a specialist dietitian and specialist nurses (key workers). The team meets every Thursday afternoon to review the biopsy results and scans of their patients.

# When will I be given the results of my tests?

Following the MDT meeting we may contact you to invite you to a clinic that we hold on a Friday morning to review new patients.

You are welcome to bring a friend or relative with you to this appointment, should you wish to do so.
