

Hearing aid controls






Close the battery drawer to turn the hearing aid on.

Open the battery drawer to turn the hearing aid off.





Open the battery drawer when you are not wearing the hearing aid.






There is a red marker in the right hearing aid.

Blue—Left

Red—Right

There is a blue marker in the left hearing aid.



Press the top on the rocker switch to turn the hearing aid up.

Press the bottom of the rocker switch to turn the hearing aid down.

Hearing aid batteries











Make sure the battery is in the right way round.

Remove the tab on the battery.





When the battery is low the hearing aid will beep.



When the battery has run out the hearing aid will go quiet.

Full Battery








Dead Battery A battery lasts for **7 to 10 days**.

When the battery runs out you must change it.

Take your yellow appointment card with you.




There are other places you can get batteries too.

Programs and the loop system

Talk to the Audiologist



Some hearing aids have programs.

Your audiologist will tell you if your hearing aid has a program.

Hearing better in noise




The 'loop' is a program that you can have for your hearing aid.

Loop systems help you hear better in noise.



They are found wherever you see this sign.





They are found in public places such as banks, cinemas and supermarkets.






You need to let someone know that you want to use the loop system.

They will help you.

Programs and the loop system continued



You then turn your hearing aids to the loop program.

Press and hold the Rocker switch for 2 seconds to turn the program on.

The hearing aid will beep twice





Press and hold the Rocker switch for 2 seconds to turn the program off again

The hearing aid will beep once
